Keith Ellison

was born in Newark, NJ, and raised in Atlanta, GA. He graduated Cum Laude from Savannah State University, Savannah, GA, and received a Master of Divinity Degree from The Interdenominational Theological Center, Atlanta, GA. Since 1998, he has been assigned as the senior pastor for seven churches. Moreover, he led the building of two churches in Georgia and Alabama valued over \$3.5M. Currently, Keith pastors Phillips Temple CME Church in San Diego, CA.

In March 1991, Keith enlisted in the United States Navy. Following Recruit Training Command, Orlando, FL, he reported for duty on the USS BELKNAP CG-26 homeported in Gaeta, Italy, and served during Desert Storm/Desert Shield and as a reservist, he served with Weapons Station



Charleston, Savannah, GA, and Naval Air Station Atlanta, Marietta, GA. He is a proud member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., initiated Spring 1997 through Mighty MU PHI Chapter, Savannah, GA, 7th District (Seaport Ques).

In civilian life, Keith was a manager, college instructor, educator and Chancellor of St. Paul Academy, Savannah, GA. He also has served as a member of several ministerial alliances including the Greater Huntsville Interdenominational Ministerial Fellowship (GHIMF), Toccoa Improvement Association (President), North Huntsville Community United for Action, Faith In Action Alabama, Alabama A&M University Advisory Board, Imperial Valley Yuma Association Minister's Alliance, and a member of the Huntsville Housing Authority Advisory Board overseeing a \$17M facility in downtown Huntsville. In March 2017, Keith was commissioned as a Lieutenant in the U.S. Navy, and reported to Navy Operational Support Center Nashville (NOSC) Smyrna, TN. In June 2018, he reported to the Naval Chaplaincy School and Center, Chaplains Basic Course, Ft. Jackson, SC. As a chaplain, he has been assigned to a number of staff and operational commands. Currently, Chaplain Ellison serves as the Staff Chaplain for Naval Base San Diego, San Diego, CA, responsible for over 200 tenant commands at the largest base in the Pacific.

Chaplain Ellison is a Fleet Marine Force Qualified Officer (FMFQO) and his awards include the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (w/a star in lieu of second award), Southwest Asia Medal (Bronze Star), Reserves Meritorious Good Conduct Medal (4 stars), Armed Forces Reserve Medal (Bronze), Global War on Terrorism Medal, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, and the National Defense Medal (w/a star in lieu of second award).

Chaplain Ellison and his wife, Bengy, have been married for 22 years. They have 3 children: Yvonne (21), Faith (17), and Kaitlyn (12).



As a retired Navy veteran, he assists the Veterans Administration by providing transportation for those needing transportation to and from the hospital. He is also active with our San Diego Organizing Project (SDOP) activities. A multi-faith nonpartisan network of 29 congregations helping to bridge racial, cultural, and economic divides in the San Diego community.

Solomon has been active with the Knights of Peter Claver, a black catholic fraternal organization, for over 20 years. He currently serves as the Financial Secretary for his local chapter. A parishioner of Christ the King Catholic Church since 1972, Solomon is an example of one who puts his faith in action and focuses on the work of the Lord.



Mr. Roosevelt Williams, III is a native San Diegan who is an industrious, conscientious, disciplined and self-motivated small business owner who currently holds the title of being San Diego's only African-American Cobbler. As a cobbler, he repairs men and women shoes, handbags, luggage, zippers, purses, belts and much more. He is also the 2021 CEO and President of Young Black & 'N Business, also known as YB&NB.

YB&NB is a community organization devoted to serving and motivating the overlooked and the underserved majority working together as one to be healthy, happy and successful.

Roosevelt Williams, III, founder, family man, and visionary formed Young Black & 'N Business with the hopes of providing a ladder for upward mobility for his community. This ladder would do more than help people leave the "physical" hood, but release the mental shackles formed by systematic marginalization. Today, Young Black & N' Business is proud to bring early entrepreneurs out of the darkness and into the light by helping them grow their professional network, providing high value exposure opportunities, and entrepreneurial content from real entrepreneurs.



Beginning in 2018, under his leadership, Young Black & 'N Business hosted quarterly networking mixers and two festivals and a Soulful Christmas in which over 2,000 toys were given away to disadvantaged youth. The also held business acumen clinics and courses on public speaking as well as consulting and event planning. Roosevelt Williams III has also created a poster that is going on its third year called Black Faces in High Places which highlights and recognizes community pillars and industry leaders within San Diego.

In 2020 YB&NB organized multiple free PPE giveaways and food drives including live zoom trainings on COVID-19, STEAM workshops, Tech Talk discussions for businesses on how to go from brick and mortar to click and order. They also contributed to the Census awareness campaign.

He is a devout husband and father. He has two children a daughter, Alina-Rose and son, Roosevelt IV.






